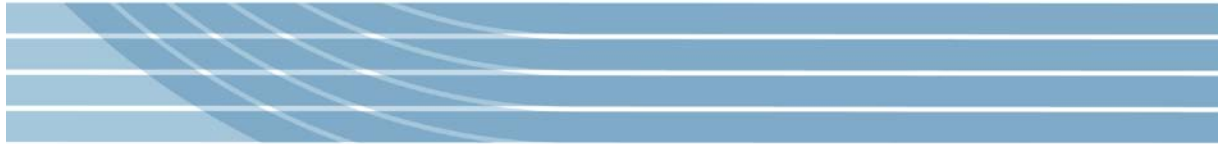

INTRODUCTION

GENERAL STRATEGY AND OBJECTIVE

The objective of the NOC Management programmes is to help National Olympic Committees (NOCs) execute their mission in the best possible way by providing them with assistance directly targeting the **execution** of their tasks (help with the improvement of various aspects of management and provision of direct subsidies), by offering **educational** opportunities to their staff and executives and by facilitating **exchanges** of information and experience among NOCs in order to improve their knowledge.

IMPROVING EXECUTION

The following opportunities available through the *NOC Administration Development* programme are aimed at helping NOCs to improve the execution of their mission:

- The *Administrative Subsidy* assists with covering NOCs' running costs.
- *NOC Management Initiatives* provide an opportunity for the implementation of projects aiming to improve particular aspects of NOCs' management.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

The following educational opportunities are available to NOCs through two programmes: *National Training Courses for Sport Administrators* and *International Executive Training Courses in Sport Management*.

- *Sport Administrators Courses* are introductory level courses on the Olympic Movement and sport administration.
- *Advanced Sport Management Courses* offer in-depth sport management training to the executives of NOCs, NFs and other national sport organisations.
- *MEMOS* is an executive masters in sport management conducted in English, French and Spanish, which enables sport managers to enhance their knowledge and develop a practical project aimed at improving the management of their organisations.

EXCHANGES

- *NOC Exchanges* make it possible for NOCs to learn from each other and find practical and tested solutions to the challenges they face.



NEW FEATURES AND EVOLUTIONS

The following are modifications and improvements introduced to the NOC Management programmes in the 2013-2016 quadrennial plan:

NOC ADMINISTRATION DEVELOPMENT

- The amount of the annual *Administrative Subsidy* has been raised by 30%, to USD 40,000.
- A financial report for the *Administrative Subsidy* received in the preceding year is now part of the application process.
- The quadrennial budget for the programme of *NOC Management Initiatives* has increased.
- NOCs wishing to improve their financial management should use the *NOC Management Initiatives* programme for that purpose.
- NOCs applying for *NOC Management Initiatives* should explain in their application how they plan to evaluate the initiative.
- The same application form is to be used for *NOC Management Initiatives* and individual *NOC Exchanges*.
- As in the past quadrennial plans, a specific area of focus has been identified for the 2013-2016 NOC Management programmes: improvement of NOCs' governance. A variety of activities will be developed to that end, details of which will be communicated throughout the quadrennial.

NATIONAL TRAINING COURSES FOR SPORT ADMINISTRATORS

- NOCs should submit one quadrennial application for both *Sport Administrators Courses* and *Advanced Sport Management Courses*. Each *Advanced Sport Management Course* should then be approved separately.
- The subsidy for *Advanced Sport Management Courses* has increased by 25%, to USD 12,000.
- The report forms for both types of courses have been simplified.
- Financial reports are required for both types of course.

INTERNATIONAL EXECUTIVE TRAINING COURSES IN SPORT MANAGEMENT

- Olympic Solidarity support has increased to compensate for the extended length of MEMOS modules.

NOC EXCHANGES

- Olympic Solidarity will work with Coach NOCs to offer exchanges targeting NOCs in need of development of specific areas.
- The same application form is to be used for *NOC Management Initiatives* and individual *NOC Exchanges*.
